Capstone Presentation Step-by-Step Guide

Step 1: Understand the Framework

Your presentation will follow the Learn, Leverage, Lead framework. Each section is essential in telling the story of your capstone journey:



Learn: Reflect on what you discovered during the process. Share specific lessons you learned about yourself, the project, or your environment. For example, what strengths did you uncover? What challenges taught you the most?



Leverage: Highlight how you applied the GROWS model in your work or life. Provide specific examples of how this framework guided you in setting goals, addressing challenges, and creating solutions.

For Lead, outline practical advice for someone embarking on a similar journey.
 Example: "I would recommend starting small with quick wins to build momentum before tackling larger challenges."

2. Use Examples:

- If you are a mentor: Share how a "Hidden Treasure" from your 360 Assessment shaped your project. **Example:** Strategic Thinking led you to develop a cross-departmental initiative to improve communication.
- If you are a mentee: Discuss how a Servant Leadership characteristic inspired your project. **Example:** Empathy drove you to create safe spaces for team feedback.



3. Craft Your Opening and Closing:

- Opening: Start with a compelling statement or story to capture attention.
 Example: "When I began this journey, I never imagined how much I'd grow as a leader."
- Closing: End with a reflection or call to action.
 Example: "This project taught me that growth isn't always easy, but it's worth it for the impact it creates."
